2. The receiving institution will send its decision within 8 weeks, provided the documents are complete.
3. A Transcript of Records will be issued by the receiving institution no later than 5 weeks after the assessment period has finished at the receiving HEI. [It should normally not exceed five weeks according to the Erasmus Charter for Higher Education guidelines]
4. Termination of the agreement

The institutions decide in mutual agreement on the procedure of modifying or terminating the agreement. In the event of unilateral termination, a notice of at least one academic year has to be given.

Description of the institutional grading system:

UFP uses ECTS credit system. 20 point grading system applied for the assessment of examinations, projects, essays, tests and other tasks. Knowledge is assessed through continuous evaluation. In the Portuguese System the marks of the university examinations are expressed out of twenty – the pass mark is 10/20 and the highest is 20/20. Class attendance is mandatory in, at least, 40% of the given lessons. In practical and laboratorial courses presence in at least, 70% of classes is required. In the Health Sciences Faculty, class attendance is mandatory to 60% of theoretical classes, 80% of practical and laboratorial courses and 90% of clinical courses.




